### **Digital documents on the aquatic world**

The AquaRing portal is to be launched – a new, innovative portal opening up access to an ocean of digital documents about the aquatic world. The portal will breathe new life into archives of digital documents and collections from aquaria, zoos, and natural history and science museums from across Europe.
